The Director and Secretary of the meeting welcomed the Chairperson of the National Executive Committee.

The Chairperson extended a heartfelt welcome to all the members present in this important meeting of the National Executive Committee of the Bharat Scouts and Guides. He expressed deep appreciation for the presence of Dr. K.P. Mishra, Vice President, Shri Satyanarayan Sharma, Vice President, Shri Chandrajit Saikia, Vice President and the State Chief Commissioners of Chhattisgarh, Delhi, Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh, Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh State.

He informed the house that this meeting is not a formality – it is a defining moment in our organisation’s history. Today we all are present here not just to discuss amendments in our Memorandum of Association but to reaffirm our commitment to the ideals of Scouting and Guiding – the ideals of service, integrity, discipline and moral courage.

Past few years the World Organisation of the Scout Movement (WOSM) and the World Associations of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS) have introduced significant changes to strengthen governance, accountability and safeguarding across the global movement. It is our responsibility to bring our Memorandum of Association in line with the constitutions of these global bodies – to ensure that Bharat Scouts and Guides remain a proud and credible member of the international fraternity.

A key aspect of this alignment is the adoption of the “Safe from Harm” Policy of WOSM and the Safeguarding Policy of WAGGGS. These are not optional add-ons. They are moral and legal imperatives that guarantee every child, and every volunteer in our movement is protected from abuse, neglect, and exploitation. As leaders, it is our duty to ensure that Scouting and Guiding in India is a safe, inclusive and nurturing environment for all. The Bharat Scouts and Guides is not an organisation of convenience; it is a movement of conscience. If we fail to attend the meetings, to engage with our youth to participate in training, to visit the grassroots, we fail not only our duty but the millions of young scouts and guides who look to us as examples. He appealed to each of them that we must prepare a new generation of Scouts and Guides who are environmentally conscious, socially responsible and emotionally resilient – young citizens who believe in the timeless motto “Be Prepared” We have also undertaken the crucial task of revising our syllabus and training programmes at all stages of Scouting and Guiding. These will now be aligned with the National Education Policy, ensuring that our youths learn not just to pass examinations but to live by values, lead by example and contribute to the nation.

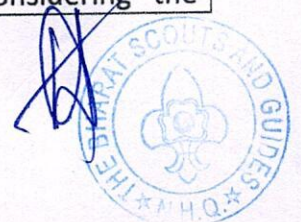

They also meet the challenges of the present trends and needs while embodying the core values of Scouting and Guiding.</p>	<p><b>Decision:</b></p> <p>Shri Madhusudan Avala, Additional International Commissioner (Scouts), made a video presentation providing an update on "Pragati Path", the revised Youth Programme of the Bharat Scouts and Guides, which had been duly approved by the National Council in its meeting held in 2024.</p> <p>He informed the House that this video had also been showcased at the 28th Asia-Pacific Regional Conference held in Taiwan, as part of the BSG Action Time Presentation, highlighting India's progressive initiatives in youth development.</p> <p>Shri Madhusudan Avala further proposed the introduction of a new Membership Badge and Shoulder Badge, presenting various design options for consideration. After due deliberation, the House unanimously approved the Purple Colour Design of Shoulder Badge and Round Membership Badge as the official choice from among the designs presented.</p>

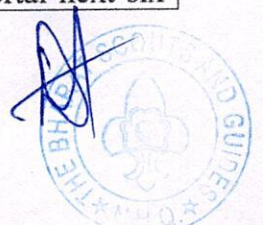

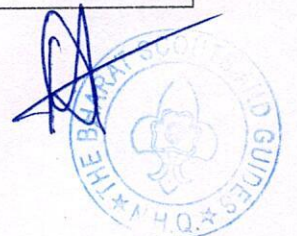

This Scheme has been launched to commemorate 75 years of the Bharat Scouts and Guides. The initiative aims to strengthen grassroot leadership, address the shortage of trained unit leaders and fast track committed Rashtrapati Awardees into adult leadership roles. 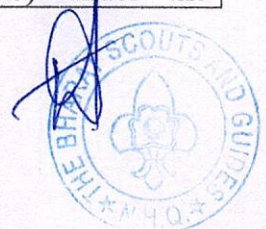

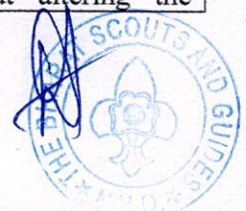

Further, the Hon'ble Chief National Commissioner informed the House that the





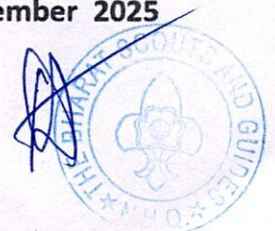
